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INDEPENDENT ACCOUNTANT'S REVIEW REPORT

We have reviewed the accompanying financial statements of Finding Our Roots, a Louisiana not-for-profit corporation, as of and for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise the Organization's basic financial statements as listed in the table of contents. A review includes primarily applying analytical procedures to management's financial data and making inquiries of management. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit, the objective of which is the expression of an opinion regarding the financial statements as a whole. Accordingly, we do not express such an opinion.

NOTE 1 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A. NATURE OF THE ORGANIZATION

Finding Our Roots, a Louisiana not-for-profit corporation, is a cultural institution focused on preserving and showcasing the history and heritage of African Americans in Terrebonne, Lafourche and St. Mary parishes. Key features include a mobile museum, exhibits, genealogy services, and educational programs.

B. BASIS OF PRESENTATION

The financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

C. CASH AND CASH EQUIVALENTS

For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, the Organization considers all unrestricted cash and other highly liquid investments with initial maturities of three months or less to be cash equivalents.

D. PROMISES TO GIVE

Contributions are recognized when the donor makes a promise to give to the Organization that is, in substance, unconditional. Contributions that are restricted by the donor are reported as increases in net assets without donor restrictions if the restrictions expire in the fiscal year in which the contributions are recognized. All other donor-restricted contributions are reported as increases in net assets with donor restrictions depending on the nature of the restrictions. When a restriction expires, net assets with donor restrictions are reclassified to net assets without donor restrictions.

E. BAD DEBTS

The financial statements of the Organization contain no allowance for uncollectible promises to give. Uncollectible accounts are recognized as an expense at the time information becomes available that indicates the amounts are uncollectible. While accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require that bad debts be recorded utilizing the allowance method, the difference between the two methods is immaterial to the Organization, as there are no outstanding promises to give at December 31, 2024.

NOTE 1 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Cont.)

F. PROPERTY AND EQUIPMENT

Property and equipment acquired by the Organization are considered to be owned by the Organization. Property and equipment are stated at cost. Depreciation is computed utilizing the double declining balance over the estimated useful lives of seven to fifteen years. Property and equipment acquisitions are capitalized if the purchase price exceeds \$1,000 and the asset has a useful life of greater than one year.

G. NET ASSETS

Net assets and revenues, expenses, gains, and losses are classified based on the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions. Accordingly, net assets of the Organization and changes therein are classified and reported as follows:

<u>Net assets without donor restrictions</u> – Net assets not subject to donor-imposed stipulations.

Net assets with donor restrictions — Net assets subject to donor-imposed stipulations that may or will be met, either by actions of the Organization and/or the passage of time, and net assets subject to donor-imposed stipulations that they be maintained permanently by the Organization. When a restriction expires, net assets with donor restrictions are reclassified to net assets without donor restrictions and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions. Generally, the donors of assets with no restriction expiration permit the Organization to use all or part of the income earned on any related investments for general or specific purposes.

H. FUNCTIONAL ALLOCATION OF EXPENSES

The costs of providing the various programs and other activities have been summarized on a functional basis in the statement of activities. Accordingly, certain costs have been allocated among the programs and supporting services benefited.

I. <u>INCOME TAXES</u>

Finding Our Roots is a not-for-profit corporation exempt from federal income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. It has been classified as an organization that is not a private foundation under Section 509(a)(1) of the Internal Revenue Code and qualifies for the charitable contributions deduction for individual donors.

J. ESTIMATES

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

NOTE 2 - FAIR VALUES OF FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

The Organization's financial instruments, which are not held for trading purposes, includes cash and cash equivalents. Management estimates that the fair value of its financial instruments as of December 31, 2024 does not differ materially from the aggregate carrying values of its financial instruments recorded in the accompanying statement of financial position.

NOTE 3 – CONCENTRATIONS OF CREDIT RISK

The Organization maintains one bank account which is insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) up to \$250,000. The Organization's deposits exceeded federally insured limits for 19 days during the year ended December 31, 2024. Management does not believe that the Organization is exposed to significant credit risk as related to its deposits.

The restrictions on net assets as of December 31, 2024 relate to a \$200,000 deposit that has been made related to the purchase of a building, which will be utilized as a permanent location of the Organization's museum and administrative offices.

NOTE 8 - UNCERTAIN INCOME TAXES

The Organization's 2023 tax return was filed appropriately. As of June 26, 2025, the Organization had not filed its 2024 tax return as the filing due date had been extended to November 15, 2025. The Organization recognizes interest and penalties, if any, related to unrecognized tax benefits in income tax expense. The Organization's tax filings are subject to audit by various taxing authorities. The Organization's open audit period is 2021 to 2024. Management has evaluated the Organization's tax position and concluded that the Organization has taken no uncertain tax positions that require adjustment to the financial statements to comply with provisions of this guidance.

NOTE 9 - LIQUIDITY AND AVAILABILITY OF FINANCIAL ASSETS

The following reflects the Organization's financial assets as of December 31, 2024, reduced by any amounts not available for general use within one year of the statement of financial position date because of contractual or donor-imposed restrictions or internal designations.

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INDEPENDENT ACCOUNTANT'S REPORT ON APPLYING AGREED-UPON PROCEDURES

To the Board of Directors and the Louisiana Legislative Auditor Finding Our Roots Houma, Louisiana

We have performed the procedures enumerated below on the Organization's compliance with certain laws and regulations contained in the accompanying Louisiana Attestation Questionnaire during the year ended December 31, 2024, as required by Louisiana Revised Statute 24:513 and the *Louisiana Governmental Audit Guide*. The Organization's management is responsible for its financial records and compliance with applicable laws and regulations.

The Organization has agreed to and acknowledged that the procedures performed are appropriate to meet the intended purpose of the engagement, which is to perform specified procedures on the Organization's compliance with the laws and regulations contained in the accompanying Louisiana Attestation Questionnaire during the year ended December 31, 2024. Additionally, the Louisiana Legislative Auditor has agreed to and acknowledged that the procedures performed are appropriate for its purposes. The report may not be suitable for any other purpose. The procedures performed may not address all the items of interest to a user of this report and may not meet the needs of all users of this report and, as such, users are responsible for determining whether the procedures performed are appropriate for their purposes.

The procedures and associated findings are as follows:

Federal, State, and Local Awards

1. Obtain the list of federal, state, and local government grant award expenditures for the fiscal year, by grant and grant year, from the Organization's management.

The Organization provided us with a list of governmental grant expenditures for the year ended December 31, 2024, comprised of \$200,000 from the State of Louisiana and \$15,000 from the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government.

For each federal, state, and local grant award, randomly select six disbursements from each grant administered during the fiscal year, provided that no more than 30 disbursements are selected. 3. Obtain documentation for the disbursements selected in Procedure 2. Compare the selected disbursements to supporting documentation, and report whether the disbursements agree to the amount and payee in the supporting documentation.

Each of the selected disbursements agreed to the amount and payee in the supporting documentation.

 Report whether the selected disbursements were coded to the correct general ledger account.

All of the disbursements were coded to the correct general ledger account.

5. Report whether the selected disbursements were approved in accordance with the Organization's policies and procedures.

The Organization's policies and procedures (unwritten) state that the President must approve all disbursements. Documentation, which comprised of canceled checks, supporting each of the selected disbursements included the signature of President.

6. For each selected disbursement made for federal grant awards, obtain the Compliance Supplement for the applicable federal program. For each disbursement made for a state or local grant award, or for a federal program not included in the Compliance Supplement, obtain the grant agreement. Compare the documentation for each disbursement to the program compliance requirements or the requirements of the grant agreement relating to activities allowed or unallowed, eligibility, and reporting; and report whether the disbursements comply with these requirements.

Activities allowed or unallowed

The Organization received a \$200,000 Act 397 appropriation from the State of Louisiana under a cooperative endeavor agreement, the entire proceeds of which were to be spent on a deposit on a building, will be used as a permanent home for the Organization's museum and administrative offices. We determined that the proceeds were spent in accordance with the terms of the cooperative endeavor agreement.

Eligibility

Based on a review of the cooperative endeavor agreement, the Organizations was eligible to receive such state funding.

Reporting

Under the terms of the state cooperative endeavor agreement, the Organization is required to submit written quarterly progress reports outlining its performance with the provisions, goals, and objectives of the agreement. Based on correspondence received from the state, the Organization has complied with the reporting requirements included in the agreement.

7. Obtain the close-out reports, if required, for any program selected in Procedure 2 that was closed out during the fiscal year. Compare the close-out reports, if applicable, with the Organization's financial records; and report whether the amounts in the close-out reports agree with the Organization's financial records.

Close-out reports are not required for the state and local grants received.

Open Meetings

8. Obtain evidence from management that agendas for meetings recorded in the minute book were posted as required by Louisiana Revised Statute 42:11 through 42:28 (the open meetings law), and report whether there are any exceptions.

We determined that the Organization is not subject to the state open meetings law.

Budget

9. For each grant exceeding five thousand dollars, obtain the comprehensive grant budgets that the Organization provided to the applicable federal, state or local grantor Organization. The Organization provided documentation that a comprehensive budget was submitted to the state for the \$200,000 cooperative endeavor agreement detailed above. The budget included the purpose and duration of the grant program, the specific goals, objectives, and measures of performance.

Accordingly, we do not express such an opinion or conclusion.

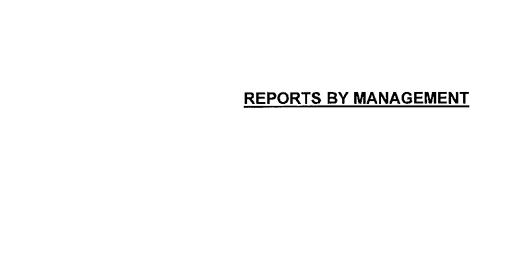
