

## **INDEPENDENT ACCOUNTANT'S REPORT ON APPLYING AGREED-UPON PROCEDURES**

We have performed the procedures enumerated below, which were agreed to by Advocates for Academic Excellence in Education, Inc., d/b/a Benjamin Franklin High School (the School), and the Orleans Parish School Board (OPSB), solely to assist the OPSB in preparing their analysis of the millage spending for the year ended June 30, 2017. The School's management is responsible for the dedicated millage report. The sufficiency of these procedures is solely the responsibility of the OPSB. Consequently, we make no representation regarding the sufficiency of the procedures described below either for the purpose for which this report has been requested or for any other purpose.

Our procedures and findings are as follows:

1. Obtain a schedule from the School of its expenditures for each purpose for the fiscal year.

2. Trace expenditures to the General Ledger.

3. Issue a report.

No exceptions were noted as a result of applying this procedure.

4. The report should be sent to OPSB, which will accumulate the information for the next millage renewal.

No exceptions were noted as a result of applying this procedure.

This agreed-upon procedures engagement was conducted in accordance with the attestation standards established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants and the applicable provisions of *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. We were not engaged to and did not conduct an examination or a review, the objective of which would be the expression of an opinion or conclusion on the dedicated millage report. Accordingly, we do not express such an opinion or conclusion. Had we performed additional procedures, other matters might have come to our attention that would have been reported to you.
